KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Indian Run Church harvested 22,000 pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables for distribution to our thirty-two partnering hot meal programs and shelters.

Christian Church garden represents approximately 100,000 pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables distributed to date. "We recognize that maintaining a community garden requires an exorbitant amount of time and hard work," shared Faith Barbato during the presentation of the award. "Fresh produce is so greatly needed during the summer months, especially when kids are out of school and without access to the nutritional requirements mandated by most school lunch programs."

Community Harvest sincerely appreciates the donations of excess food after the Pro Football Hall of Fame appreciation party and fan appreciation parties on August 5th, August 6th, and August 7th. After the appreciation party on July 22nd, over 600 pounds of chicken, hot dogs, buns, fresh watermelon, pasta, beans, various salads, and desserts were picked-up and transported to Refuge of Hope, a men's emergency shelter that provides over 25,000 nutritious meals to hunger men, women, and children throughout the summer months of June, July, and August alone.

Another 4,800 pounds of food was later delivered to Refuge of Hope and Hope Outreach Ministries after the fan appreciation parties

during the first week of August. "Collecting excess food after the Hall of Fame festivities each year is the epitome of how our program is designed to work and why it is so efficient," commented Faith Barbato, Executive Director. "There are

hundreds of events that take place in Stark County on any given week. We take the guess work out of determining how to transport the leftover food and where it should go. Knowing that excess food can be turned into something beneficial for the community with one phone call is truly priceless." The Pro Football Hall of Fame and Canton Regional Chamber of Commerce work so diligently to host a "One of a Kind Celebration." We are extremely grateful that they included us in the details! STARK COUNTY SHERIFF'S GARDEN

Community Harvest was chosen as the local hunger program to receive and distribute produce from the Stark County Sheriff's Jail Garden again this year. The 2016 inmate garden is larger than previous years with the help of Rudy Moyer, a master gardener with the Ohio State University extension who carefully thought out the harvesting of fruits and vegetables that are a little heartier, including bell peppers, green beans, squash, zucchini, leaf lettuce, radishes, and watermelons. Current board President, Todd Civiello, had the honor of picking-up the first donation of food near the end of July. "This is an incredible way to teach life skills that the inmates can take with them after they are released while positively impacting our community," he shared at a recent board meeting.








